

ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS: PRESENTATION TOPICS

- Work in pairs or on your own.
 - Find an article from the National Geographic about an environmental or nature-related topic that piques your interest.
 - Highlight the main points of the article for the rest of the class and teach them at least 10 challenging words.
 - Look for more recent articles discussing the same topic from scientific newspapers like *The New Scientist*, *Nature*, *Scientific American* or other reliable sources like WWF or Greenpeace. Try to avoid Wikipedia and provide at least 4 sources.
 - Explore recent developments from a new perspective. If the original article was about urbanization in China you could, for example, discuss and compare urbanization in India.
- Create a hand-out for the rest of the class. Make it personal and current!
- When presenting, use layman's terms so that everyone understands what you are talking about! Use real life examples, pictures and PowerPoint or Prezi.com.
