

APARTHEID

Literally "apartness" in Afrikaans. A policy of racial segregation introduced by the National Party after its electoral victory in 1948. It created a highly stratified society in which whites dominated politically, economically, and socially at the expense of blacks.



AFRIKANER

Dutch term for "native of Africa"; refers to whites who speak the Afrikaans language.


